Amendments to By-laws

At the June 2010 SCT Board Meeting, the board approved the proposal of two amendments to the current by-laws, last revised June 14, 2009. These amendments will be presented to the general membership for approval at a special meeting called for that purpose. The Special General Meeting will be held on Wednesday, September 15, 2010 at 7:00 at the Schuylerville High School. All current active adult members are eligible to vote on these amendments and are encouraged to attend this meeting on the 15th.

The first proposed amendment is to Add to Article VII – Standing and Special Committees - Section 4. Audit Committee: There shall be an independent Audit Committee of at least two (2) people, one of whom will be a member of the board of directors, who will serve as the chairperson and another person, selected by the chairperson. Neither the President nor the Treasurer may sit on this committee; committee many years of service both on and off the stage. Mikaela Thomas was awarded the Budding Twig Award for her talent and interest in the arts with a special place in her life for the SCT Children's Theater.

Election results were announced and Christopher Tucker was reelected to another three year term

and new board members, Donna Dodd-Thomas, Jeremy Hammond and Elinor Stein were each elected for a three year term; congratulations to all. At the time of the annual meeting, there was an-

other one year term vacancy on the board as a result of a resignation earlier in the year. Following the annual meeting, Bev McKim did step forward to fill the duration of the term. Thanks Bev.

Members, other than the Chairperson, do not have to be Board members. The committee should have adequate financial literacy to understand, analyze and assess the organization's financial statements. The Audit Committee shall perform an annual audit of the financial activities of the corporation and report the results to the entire Board of Directors.

The second proposed amendment to the by-laws is to change current by-law regarding officers to read as follows: [text in brackets to be removed] - Article V - OFFIC-ERS - Section 2. The officers shall be elected by a majority vote of the Board of Directors at the first regular monthly meeting of the board following the annual meeting, and serve until the next successive annual meeting. [The President may serve a maximum of two consecutive terms in the same office]. All [other] officers may serve as they and the membership agree to without restriction of term.


